






Number of times to reuse alternative bags to match environmental impact of single-use plastic bag






# What are plastics?

- Synthetic or semi-synthetic polymers
- Short for thermoplastic = mouldable using heat
- Organic compounds
  - just like wood, paper or wool
- Made from natural materials
  - mainly crude oil or natural gas, but also coal, salt (all non-renewable resources) and cellulose (renewable resource)

# The good, the bad and the ugly...

- Recyclable
- Low emissions
- Additives
- Polymers degrade
- Leaching
- Cheap to make virgin
- Production increasing
- Many superfluous single use items
- Persistent waste taking many 100s of years to breakdown

# Core Principles for the Recyclability of Plastics



#### Use same material

Use mono-materials or mixed materials of the same type wherever possible. If different materials have to be used they should be different densities.



#### Minimise colour

Non-pigmented plastic is preferred. If colour is necessary, avoid strong colours as much as possible.



#### Easily separable closures

These should be easy to detach, should leave no attachments once removed and ideally be recyclable themselves.



#### Avoid full sleeves

If a sleeve must be used, it should be easily removable and there should be clear instructions explaining how to detach it





#### Small, easily removable labels

Adhesives should be used sparingly and labels should cover no more than 60% of the product's surface area, as well as being easy to remove.




Household and commercial waste and recycling composition estimates for England, 2017 (tonnes)


#### Plastic waste generation per person, 2010



Daily plastic waste generation per person, measured in kilograms per person per day. This measures the overall per capita plastic waste generation rate prior to waste management, recycling or incineration. It does not therefore directly indicate the risk of pollution to waterways or marine environments.



- Global movement
- Encourage the move away from single-use
- To reduce plastics pollution
- So we can have cleaner streets, oceans and communities

## What should we do as a society?

- Government policy:
  - Ban on microbeads in cosmetics (US in 2015, UK in 2018), ban on sale of straws, cotton-buds and drink stirrers (UK April 2021)
- Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR)
  - The UK plastics industry pays towards recycling costs via Packaging Recovery Notes (PRNs)
  - System needs reform as virgin plastics still more economical than recyclable plastics
- Plastic packaging is changing to become more recyclable

## What can we do as individuals?

We have already made an impact

- Public campaigns have already had an impact
  - Government policy (previous slide)
- Individual behaviour changes
  - Carrying reusable bottles, coffee cups and bags is common and single-use plastic bag usage has dropped (83% fewer bags issued 2016/17 compared to 2014)
  - Recycling is increasing

#### Caffeine fix...

Carry your own cup for hot drinks, no guilt energy



#### Eco-protect

Use washable masks to protect others & the planet



#### Wipe wisely

'No' to disposable wipes, carry wet flannel bags



Clean teeth & planet

Purchase bamboo brushes & toothpaste tablets



#### Loose leaf tea caddy

Use plastic-free tea bags or better still, a reusable caddy



#### "No packages" lunch

Replace snack packs with filled reusable pots



#### Buy bulk

Buy large & decant into small reusable containers



#### Sanitary swaps

Change to reusable nappies, period & incontinence pads



#### Reduce & Reuse

Reuse wipes/hankies; reduce plastic-wrapped tissues



#### Guilt-free takeout

Ask takeaways & shops to fill your reusable containers



#### Cut the cling film

Silicon covers, reusable pouches & beeswax wraps



#### Love a library

Share stuff amongst family, friends & neighbours



#### Chewing plastic!

Give up the gum or swap for a plastic-free version



#### Glitter-less

Ready-made microplastics; use a different decoration!



#### Moo-ve on

Refill reusable glass bottles for milk & juices



#### Height of fashion

Bargain hunt second hand clothing & repair favourites



#### Naked bars

Packaging free soap bars for hands, hair, body, shaving...



#### Bin the butt

Cigarettes contain plastic -QR gives NHS advice to stop



#### Love a loofah

Swap the plastic dish cloths for a vegetable that cleans!



#### Green gardening

Substitute plastics outside plastics become brittle



Don't be lured by free gifts with meals & magazines



Burst the balloon

Why not create reusable bunting instead?

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





We need your help to create a paradigm shift in how we understand and respond to pollution.






