| Problem based learning and group presentations at M level Paul Hopkins, Centre for Educational Studies | |
| Abstract: | |
| We have been looking to develop a model of assessment for the Post Graduate Certificate of Education (PGCE) which: | |
| (i) offers a more varied diet than the "4,000 to 6,000 word essay" which seems to be the staple diet of much M level provision. | |
| (ii) offers students a glimpse into the "real world" scenarios that they will encounter once they are teaching in schools and | |
| (iii) which allows collaboration alongside individual effort. | |
| So, we have developed a problem based learning approach which mixes a group presentation with a short reflective report (2,000) to form a 20 credit M level (L7) assessment piece. The presentation will be assessed by two tutors and using a piece of software called WebPA which allows individual assessment from a group presentation. | |

We hope that the combination of these factors will give assessment that is more relevant, contextual and realistic.
